A national expert on colleges and higher education, Rob is a publisher, editor, author, lecturer, media contributor, and former college admissions administrator. His career in education spans 33 years.

As Editor-in-Chief at [The Princeton Review](#)<sup>®</sup>, he oversees its [line](#) of 150+ Princeton Review books—from test-prep guides to study aids—that are distributed by Penguin Random House. Rob also directs The Princeton Review's annual surveys of students, parents, and school administrators.

It is his interactions with students, parents, educators, and counselors, however, that Rob cites as his most inspiring professional experiences. Over the years, he has visited more than 1,200 high schools and more than 1,000 colleges and graduate schools. He gives more than 100 talks a year to audiences of students, parents and counselor/advisors and he has delivered commencement addresses at three universities. Rob also presents keynotes and chairs panels at many regional and national education conferences including the National Association of College Admission Counseling (NACAC) conference.

Rob is author of four books: [The Best 390 Colleges](#); [The Best Value Colleges](#); [College Admission 101](#); and [Colleges That Create Futures](#). He also spearheaded the publications of [The Ultimate Guide to HBCUs](#) and [The College Wellness Guide](#).

As director of The Princeton Review's surveys, Rob has polled millions of college and graduate school students for the company's annual school rankings. Based entirely on student's ratings of their schools, the rankings are tallied in dozens of categories and reported by hundreds of media. Rob also oversees the company's [College Hopes & Worries Survey](#) of college applicants and their parents, now in its 23rd year, as well as its [College Administrator Summer Survey](#), now in its 6th year.

Rob has hosted 140+ videos on The Princeton Review's [YouTube channel](#) which collectively have received more than a million views. Among them: [The ACT is Changing: 5 Things to Know](#), [3 DOs + 2 DON'Ts for Taking the Digital SAT](#), and [SAT vs ACT: How to Choose the Right Test](#).

We listen!*" Rob has also been on ABC, CBS, CNN, FOX, NPR, PBS, and NHK (Japan) programs as well as *Teen Kids News*, an Emmy-award winning syndicated show.

Rob earned his B.A. at Drew University (NJ) and serves on its Board of Trustees. Prior to joining The Princeton Review in 1999, he was a college admissions administrator at Wagner College (NY) for six years.

A resident of Manhattan, Rob is a New York City history buff and an avid runner.
